I. HOW GOD PROVIDES

1. GOD PROVIDES GRACIOUSLY

“In the desert the whole community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The Israelites said to them, “If only we had died by the LORD’s hand in Egypt! There we sat around pots of meat and ate all the food we wanted, but you have brought us out into this desert to starve this entire assembly to death.”

2. GOD PROVIDES MIRACULOUSLY

“The Lord said to Moses, “I will rain down bread from heaven for you.”
Exodus 16:4a (NIV)

3. GOD PROVIDES ABUNDANTLY

“Each one is to gather as much as he needs. Take an omer for each person.”
Exodus 16:16 (NIV)

4. GOD PROVIDES FAITHFULLY

“The Israelites ate manna forty years, until they came to a land that was settled; they ate manna until they reached the border of Canaan.”

II. HOW TO EXPERIENCE SATISFACTION IN LIFE

1. RECOGNIZE YOUR REAL HUNGER

2. STOP EATING JUNK FOOD
